 - Protestant – 0.6%

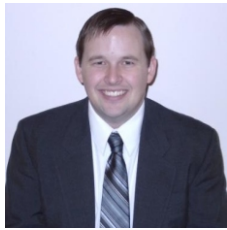

Chris' Testimony



My first introduction to the gospel came at the end of my junior year in high school when a friend invited me to her church. I attended Community Baptist Church with her, not knowing what to expect. I sat in the back row and listened to the pastor talk about God. During the invitation the pastor asked if there was anyone in the auditorium who was not sure that they would go to



Heaven if they died today. Though it was very difficult, I raised my hand and acknowledged that I was a sinner on my way to Hell. On October 27, 1999, I surrendered my life to

Christ. My life was completely changed. I gave up my old lifestyle, my old friends and became very active in church. God truly did save me!

In 2001 I heeded the leading of God and surrendered to go into full-time ministry. I received my training at Atlantic Baptist Bible College in Chester, Virginia. I attended ABBC for 3 years and graduated with a bachelor's degree in Pastoral Theology. It was also at ABBC that I met my lovely wife, Erika.

After graduation I went back to my home church, Community Baptist Church, to work in the ministry with Pastor Mike Aylestock. While at CBC, I have led the Youth, Outreach and Children's Ministries. I have also played a big role in the construction of CBC's new \$2.7 million church building.

At the time the pamphlet was produced, there were only 18 Independent Baptist Missionaries in the whole country – less than one missionary per state. When compared to Oklahoma, a state similar in size which has 15 independent Baptist churches in just one of its cities, the great need of Uruguay can be easily seen.

In September 2008, we were privileged to spend several weeks in Uruguay. Our love for the people and the desire to reach them with the gospel and start churches increased in our souls. Uruguay is a country of great need and we are thankful that the Lord has called our family to go and reach the Uruguayan people with His glorious gospel.
